

ENROLMENT SCHEME FOR 2023



The board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Taieri College for 2023.

Enrolment at Taieri College is governed by an enrolment scheme, details are below. The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is **Thursday 18 August 2022**. Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

The board has determined that **10 places at Year 9** are likely to be available for out-of-zone students next year. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on **Friday 14 October 2022**. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and/or shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at Taieri College. **The zone includes both sides of the road.**

Eastern Boundary: Taieri Mouth Rd from the Taieri River to Brighton-Scroggs Hill Rd. Along Brighton-Scroggs Hill Rd to Scroggs Hill Rd. Along Scroggs Hill Rd (including Scurr Rd and Jaffray Hill Rd) to Dunedin Southern Motorway SH1. Along Dunedin Southern Motorway SH1 to Morris Rd. Along Morris Rd to Chain Hills Rd. Along Chain Hills Rd (including those houses accessed off both sides of this road). A line from the end of Chain Hills Rd to Friends Hill Rd. Then a line from Friends Hill Rd to the corner of Flagstaff-Whare Flat Rd and Rollinsons Rd.

Northern Boundary: A line from the corner of Flagstaff-Whare Flat Rd and Rollinsons Rd to the end of Summer Hills Rd. A line from the end of Summer Hills Rd to Nenthorn Stream. Over the Nenthorn Stream to Nenthorn Rd. Along Nenthorn Road to Moonlight Rd. Then a line from Moonlight Rd to Mason Rd (via Hartfield Rd and Sheepwash Creek). Along Mason Rd to Hyde-Middlemarch SH87.

Western Boundary: Along Hyde-Middlemarch SH87 to McKinnon Rd. Along McKinnon Rd to Gladbrook Rd. Along Gladbrook Rd to Rock Rd. Along Rock Rd to Top Rd. Along Top Rd to Gladbrook Rd. Along Gladbrook Rd to Kidds Rd. Along Kidds Rd to Sutton-Clarks Junction Rd SH87. Along Sutton-Clarks Junction Rd SH87 to Young Rd. Along Young Rd. A line from the end of Young Rd to Rocklands Rd. Along Rocklands Rd to Old Dunstans Rd. Along Old Dunstans Rd to Welshs Rd. Along Welshs Rd. A line from the end of Welshs Rd to Lake Mahinerangi (including Black Rock Runs Rd; El Dorado Track; and Lammerlaw Rd). Across Lake Mahinerangi to Mahinerangi Rd. Along Mahinerangi Rd to the corner with Waipori Falls Rd. A line from here to Shaw Rd.

Southern Boundary: Along Shaw Rd to Berwick Rd. Along Berwick Rd to Waipori River Rd. Along Waipori River Rd to Lee Creek. Along Lee Creek via Lake Waipori to the Waipori River Bridge over SH1. From Waipori River Bridge and along the Taieri River to Riverside Rd. Along Riverside Rd to Marine Parade. Along Marine Parade to Findlayson Rd. Along Findlayson Rd to the corner with Sheffield St. Then a line to the end of Sawmill Rd. A line from the end of Sawmill Rd to the end of Coutts Gully Rd. A line from the end of Coutts Valley Rd to the corner of Taieri Beach Rd and Akatore Creek Rd. Along Akatore Creek Rd to the corner with Akatore Rd. Then a line to the coast.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- First Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- Second Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- Third Priority** will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- Fourth Priority** will be given to applicants who are children of board employees.
- Fifth Priority** will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, or fourth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary. Under Section 11G (1) on the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
