Teacher Profile Miss Miller New Zealand Triathlete

Miss Miller was a high school student and Maniototo Area School and this is where she was heavily involved in sports. At high school Miss Miller played "everything" including Netball, Skiing, Softball, Touch, Tennis and Volleyball. The beginning of Miss Miller doing triathlons was about six years ago and she began taking it more seriously about two years ago. This is the first time that she will be competing for New Zealand in Triathlons, qualifying in December last year and will be going to Lausanne, Switzerland to compete in the ITU World Triathlon Grand Final. There are 70 triathletes from across New Zealand going to compete and there are three different events; the standard triathlon which Miss Miller will be involved in, a sprint and an elite triathlon. Miss Miller's advice for anyone interested in triathalons is "it is a cool sport and anyone can do it if they work hard and put the hard yards in, it's just a skill based sport."

Young Writers' Awards


This week's featured categories include Poetry and Drama Script.

Completed individually, entries can be any length, rhymed or unrhymed. Very short poems, however, may not be judged as favorably as longer ones reflecting greater effort. Use a suitable title. The subject may be serious or humorous. It may be shaped on the page.

DRAMA SCRIPT

Collaborative efforts of up to three people may submit entries in this category. Drama scripts may be any length – a simple sketch or a piece of dialogue or monologue, and could contain one or several scenes. Stage directions must be included. It should be set out as a play script with dialogue and stage directions, as well as a captivating title.
