# Teacher Profile Mr Tabb

Mr Tabb went to Marlborough Boys College where he enjoyed playing a range of sports which lead on to him excelling in sport. These sports included cycling, basketball, netball, bodybuilding and rugby. Mr Tabb first started body building when he was 18 years old and then went on to compete when he was 27. He is in training now for a competition coming up but hasn't competed since 1999. The thing that made Mr Tabb compete in bodybuilding was that he used to be a long-distance road cyclist and enjoyed the training for this and wanted a way to put it into use without cycling, which is where bodybuilding came along. When he was younger, he was very tall, skinny and a bit insecure so wanted to buff up which included weight training. In 1991 he played for the New Zealand under 21 netball side which was only one of his major sporting achievements. Another one of his achievements was winning the New Zealand Heavyweight Competition in 1999. When training for body building



there is a lot of preparation. On the off season he does heavy weights and eats a lot and before a competition he does more cardio and wants to lose body fat, so at the moment he is eating more than 7 meals a day full of carbohydrates. He does make sacrifices, but it comes with many positives and has taught him to work hard for his goals, and now he can give back what he has learnt by training and judging body builders. For the competition coming up he will be competing by himself and in pairs with his wife (winner of Miss Universe 2007). For anyone wanting to get into bodybuilding, Mr Tabb's advice it to "know what you're training for and train for that".

# Young Writers' Awards – Entries are due Wednesday 25 September, 3:00pm to the English Department Office.

#### **SHORT STORY**

Completed individually, this can be a story consisting of a minimum of 200 words. There should be a suitable title and it should be formatted with paragraphs. The content may be a real experience, an adapted real experience or fiction. It does not have to come solely from a classroom activity.

#### **PROJECT**

Also completed individually, this is an investigation into a subject of your interest. It may derive from your classwork in any subject, or it may be a hobby topic, e.g. the Royal Family, the Albatross colony, a mathematics investigation, the Maori Battalion, etc. It does not have to come solely from classwork. Be creative with how you present your work – it could be in the form of a report, brochure, poster, diorama.

#### **ESSAY/ARTICLE**

This section is completed individually. An essay is a presentation of your ideas and opinions about a subject such as Road Safety, Uniform, Conservation etc. You could be aiming to persuade the reader to act/behave/think in a different way. An article is a presentation of information and ideas about a subject such as Taieri history, animals, your family, your job, an historic event etc. Your article may relate to some study you have done. It does not have to come solely from a classroom activity. Submitted work should have a catchy title and be formatted in paragraphs.

#### CHILDREN'S ILLUSTRATED BOOK

This may be a combined effort of up to two people (e.g. a text writer and an illustrator). The book must be at least six pages long, but the page size is not restricted. It should be suitable for pre-school children to read or to have read to them. (i.e. the text and pictures may be quite simple).


#### **POEM**

Completed individually, entries can be any length, rhymed or unrhymed. Very short poems, however, may not be judged as favourably as longer ones reflecting greater effort. Use a suitable title. The subject may be serious or humorous. It may be shaped on the page.

#### **DRAMA SCRIPT**

Collaborative efforts are possible and up to three people may submit entries in this category. Drama scripts may be any length – a simple sketch or a piece of dialogue or monologue, and could contain one or several scenes. Stage directions must be included. It should be set out as a play script with dialogue and stage directions, as well as a captivating title.

#### Dear Parent/Caregiver

Taieri College has been advised that since 22 August 2019, five people have been confirmed with measles in the Southern region and the disease is now likely to be spreading in the wider community.



The number of cases may seem relatively small in comparison with the population, but one person with measles can infect many others.

PHS advises that immunisation is the best protection against measles. **Immunisation is safe, effective and free.** 

Measles is a serious and highly infectious viral disease that causes fever, cough, sore red eyes and a rash. It can make people very sick. People with measles can be infectious even before they start feeling unwell. While almost all people will make a complete recovery, it can lead to hospitalisation and in rare cases, death.

Parents/guardians need to find out whether their children are protected against measles. Regarding your child's immunisation status:

- If your child has not received their measles immunisation (MMR vaccine) as per the Immunisation Schedule (1st MMR at 15 months and 2nd MMR at four years), call your GP as soon as possible. Arrange a time to immunise your child as it is never too late.
- Infants and children who are not travelling to Auckland or overseas to a country with a measles outbreak are recommended to get their MMR vaccinations as per the Immunisation Schedule at 15 months and 4 years.
- Infants aged 6 to 11 months who are travelling to Auckland or overseas to a country with a measles outbreak, can have their first MMR vaccination (MMR0) after consulting with their GP, however they will still need to have the MMR vaccinations at 15 months and four years as per the Immunisation Schedule.
- Infants aged 12 to 14 months who are travelling to Auckland or overseas to a country with a measles outbreak, should receive all four 15 month vaccinations (MMR, varicella, Hib and PCV10) at least two weeks before travelling to allow immunity against measles to develop.
- If your child has received only one measles immunisation (i.e. one MMR vaccination), call your GP as soon as possible to see if you need to arrange a time to immunise your child with their second MMR. Two measles immunisations provide better protection than one.
- If your child has received two measles immunisations, or they have definitely had doctordiagnosed measles infection in the past, they are considered protected. Over 99% of people who are fully immunised are protected from measles.
- If you are not sure of your child's immunisation records, look in your child's Plunket book or check with your GP.
- If your child is not immune or you choose not to immunise your child, they are not protected from measles. If they come into contact with someone with measles, they will likely have to be excluded from school or ECEC for up to 14 days.

#### Signs of measles

It usually takes 10 to 14 days for someone who has caught measles to start showing symptoms.

If your child develops a high fever, runny nose, cough, sore red eyes, or a rash see a doctor (call ahead to alert your doctor about the possibility of measles before visiting and take this letter along).

If your child has a weakened immune system (e.g. if they have an inherited immune problem or are receiving chemotherapy for cancer), please contact your doctor to discuss further.

If this occurs: Call your GP or Healthline (0800 611 116) as soon as possible for advice. Your GP will advise the safest time for your child to return to school. If your GP suspects measles, they will arrange for testing and Public Health South will be in contact to offer support and any follow up regarding contact tracing.
