

Taieri College netball is fortunate to have John Mathias coaching our Senior A netball team this year.

Our first round of netball for the Senior A team has been completed. The goal for the team at the start of the season was to move to Prem B. In 2020 the team won Prem C but due to Covid, teams did not move up as would normally happen at the end of the 2020 season.

The Senior A team, therefore, started as one of the eight teams in Prem C for 2021 and faced a highly skilled Taieri Club team in their first game, losing that 61-24. Games against teams such as Macandrew A, Physed Navy, Union Albion all followed and by the time the last game was about to occur the team was sitting second equal with two other teams. The Senior A team needed to win their last game by 12 or more to make it to the "Promotion Relegation Game" against the seventh placed team in Prem B, College White.



A gutsy and tight win last Saturday against Physed Royal by 13 goals secured the team that chance to be promoted. It was great to see so many supporters there on Tuesday night as our team took on College White. The Taieri team came out strong to lead by 20 goals at half time. College came back strongly in the second half, however, Taieri came away with a 60 -34 win to earn a place in Prem B for the rest of the 2021 season.

Well done to the girls and coach, John Mathias, who have worked very hard since the beginning of the season to continually improve and upskill. The challenge is not over as they will face some formidable opposition in Round 2 beginning June 12. Good luck girls and keep working hard.







Learning High Frequency Words

Fancy a new twist on Snakes and Ladders? Got a word list to learn for a new topic? This fun way of learning vocabulary will be a winner with all the family.

How to play:


- 1. Players take turns to roll the dice. The player with the highest number goes first, the person with the second highest goes second and so on.
- 2. The player moves the counter the number of spaces shown on the dice.
- 3. The player must read the word on the board and either:
 - use the word in a sentence
 - recall the definition of the word
- 4. If a player lands on a snake's head, slide the counter down to the snake's tail.
- 5. If the player lands on the bottom of the ladder, the player's counter climbs to the square at the top of the ladder.
- 6. The first player to reach Finish wins!

This can help students develop their definitions of key terms.
