On Monday we are fortunate to have Brando Yelavich coming to visit and speak to our students. Brando is a young explorer from New Zealand who, on the 24 August 2014, was the first person to walk the coastline of New Zealand (8700km over 600 days). Since then, Brando has completed numerous self-supported adventures around the globe.

Brando completed his first adventure at 19 years old, when he circumnavigated New Zealand's beautiful coastline. He climbed, walked, ran, and swam around the entire country, living off the land, catching fish, wild birds, wild rabbits and whatever else he could get his hands on, using a guide to all the edible plants for assistance. Contributions to Brando's incredible feat went to the Ronald McDonald House, raising money and awareness for all the children and families who are under their care. Brando's circumnavigation was inspired by his own depression. He knew he was headed down the wrong path in life and needed to change his direction in a big way. The journey almost cost him his life on several occasions; it took him 600 days to travel more than 8500km, basically alone.

Since then, Brando has completed multiple self-supported adventures, including:

- Surviving in the wilderness of Stewart Island, 30 days 570km
- Skiing across the Greenland Icecap 33 days 600km
- Kayaking around the largest island on the west coast of the Americas; Vancouver Island 72 days 4780km
- In 2019, Brando was the first person to cycle across Australia west to east through the deserts 130 days 5555km

We are indebted to the Rotary Club of Taieri who have made Brando's visit possible. My thanks to them for their generosity in making Brando's visit possible.

Spelling strategies for home

Learning to spell correctly is a crucial skill for life. Students begin to learn the basics of the English language as soon as they start school. Their skills and knowledge are built upon as they progress throughout their education, but the English language is one of the most difficult languages in the world to spell.

Many words in the English language follow specific rules and students will be taught these rules at school. However, some just have to be learned and the weekly spelling list can often be greeted with dread by parents.

Each week until the end of term there will be three fun ways to learn the spelling of words, try these:

Use each word in a silly sentence. The sillier the sentence, the more memorable. Underline the spelling word in each sentence.

For example: Spelling the word <u>purple</u>.

My dog wears a blue and purple dress when he takes a bath.

Pick 5 spelling words. For each word write a group of words that look like your spelling word but are misspelled slightly.

Don't forget to include the correct spelling word to the group of words, too. DO NOT SOLVE.

Example: rightt

rite

right

rihgt

Write each word and include a silly picture.

For example, if one of the words is "thumb", draw a hand with the word itself instead of the thumb.

The Junior Girls are coached by Luke Bouman, assisted by Jenny Hooper and managed by Marina Roxburgh. They are playing in the stacked Premier Grade. Each week they are looking to improve upon the fundamentals of the sport, including footwork, passing, shooting, dribbling, defence and spacing.

The Junior Boys are head coached by Ethan McKinlay, assisted by Jared Gibson and managed by Janine McIntosh. After a rocky start, they completed their grading games by beating Kavanagh College in a must-win game. They are going strong in the A-grade, proving that they will be contenders in the Premier Grade now that they are reinstated to the highest grade. 












HOLIDAY BRIDGE
