Welcome back to the final term of the school year. I trust everyone enjoyed their holiday, including the typical mix of changeable Spring weather.

We are hoping for warm days ahead as we have now decommissioned our boiler for replacement. Our boilers were refurbished coal boilers that burned wood pellets. As well as being very old and susceptible to breakdown, they also couldn't burn in a manner that satisfied current emission standards. Our new boilers will burn wood chips and are designed to be more efficient while at the same time staying below current emission standards. It is a massive undertaking to replace our boiler system and the only time to do this is over the summer months. It is planned that our new system will be up and running by the end of Term 1 next year. Let's hope for a warm Summer!

This weekend over 600 ex-students from Mosgiel District High School, Mosgiel Intermediate, The Taieri High School and Taieri College are assembling on the Taieri to celebrate 151 years of education in Mosgiel. After being unable to proceed last year, it is with relief that we can welcome everyone back to school to share old stories and renew old acquaintances. Reunion 2022

Taieri College head students, Leah Dixon and Ollie Mackenzie, will be addressing our reunion guests this Saturday. This is the speech they will be giving to the attendees, which has a great reflection on how education has changed over the years as well as illustrating the strengths of the strong community existing on the Taieri Plain:

Kia Ora everyone and welcome back to Taieri College. I am Leah and this is Ollie; we are the current head students this year and are honoured to be speaking to you today. We are in our last year at Taieri College so we know a fair bit about how it runs today. We are in Year 1,3 although most of you would know it as 7th Form. Modern day Taieri College is a community that supports diversity, uniqueness, and encourages us to be ourselves. We learn everything from Maths and English to Drama, Photography and Automotive. Ollie and I are proud to represent the student body and this great school with so much history.

We assume the school looks a bit different from when you were here, for example we ditched the typewriters and all bring our own laptops now, giving us round the clock access to our teachers and lessons. This is helpful for a midnight hand in of an assessment, but the teachers may not agree when we email with questions at 10pm on a Friday night. Data projectors replaced chalkboards where the teachers can write notes which appear straight onto our laptop screens. Then, when Covid happened we had 30 people zoom calls from our bedrooms instead of sitting at desks. These things are very normal to us but to our understanding this is the complete opposite to how your education was at Taieri. Technology has changed the way schooling works, for the better.

There is a huge variety of arts and cultural opportunities for us to take at Taieri. From our amazing Kapa Haka group to the jazz band, choir, and theatre sports to name a few. As well as being Head Girl I am also an Arts Prefect and have thoroughly enjoyed the experiences and opportunities available to me. For example, I learnt how to fire dance just last Tuesday. The Taieri College of today encourages to think outside of the box and to follow our passions.

Additionally, to the Head Boy role I am also a sports prefect. We offer a wide variety of sports to participate in from the more commonly known rugby, netball, and cricket, to equestrian, shooting, and triathlon. Through sports at Taieri I have been given the opportunity to travel across the world and meet new people. Sport is very important to us, and this is shown in our alumni as we have produced gold medallists, and national sports coaches.

While we know a fair bit about how this school looks and works today, we have also grown-up hearing stories about our relatives who went here. Both our mums were students at The Taieri High School, with Ollie's graduating in 1990 and my mum graduated in 1989; I followed in her footsteps as Head Girl as she also had that role all the way back then. I learnt recently that there has been a member of my family continuously at this school, either as a student or a teacher, for the last 51 years. My grandad taught Geography and History at The Taieri High School for over 30 years. I know him as Grandad but some of you may know him as Mr Letts. He has told me about many great stories from his memories as 7th Form Dean, coaching cricket, and school ski trips. Funnily enough he started working at Taieri in 1971, which was celebrating the centennial anniversary of the school and now I stand in front of you at the 150th anniversary as his grandaughter.

With a student count, now, of over 1200 students, there are many of us with stories like mine and family connections going back years and years. I've been taught by teachers who taught my mum, Ollie's mum, or have taught with my grandad back in the day; for example Mrs Hill and Mrs Mortimer have taught me Mathematics, Mr Campbell taught me Japanese, and Mr Macdonald taught me Economics. Education is always changing but it's great that we can connect to our families' past and the past of this school. We encourage you to share some of your stories with us also so that we can learn from you all here today. Thank you for listening to us and we hope that you all have a great weekend reminiscing on old memories.

We interview applicants during the first two weeks of November. Current Year 11 and 12 students can apply, they must choose Careers as one of their subjects for 2023. Speed Careers Meets with Year 11s – we are currently completing quick interviews with all Year 11 students and recording details of school and career pathway plans on our Career Central system. It has been a real pleasure to have a quick chat with our Year 11s and we look forward to assisting this group as they move through the school!


