The focus this week has been our NCEA evidence examinations for our senior students. Well done to those who have used this opportunity as a starting point in their preparation for end of year final examinations. Collating notes, revising, and becoming familiar with examination questions are important steps to gaining high level results later in the year. Evidence examinations are also important should a student be absent from their end of year examination, hence the term evidence exams. A derived grade is calculated for absent students in final examinations and evidence exams are used to formulate that grade.

The results of these examinations can lead to several courses of action. If they aren't as successful as hoped they can be an excellent motivational tool for increasing study time for the final examinations, or if they are pleasing results, they can build confidence and provide assurance that things are on track for the rest of the year.

Term 3 ushers in the business end of many winter school sports seasons, culminating in the annual School Sport NZ Winter Tournament Week events where close to 40,000 students, teachers, coaches, and whānau will be part of more than 40 events across the country. Good luck to our Senior A Netballers in Invercargill, our Under 15 Rugby team in Alexandra, and our Mixed Hockey team in Oamaru. I challenge all teams to be competitive, be respectful, and most importantly enjoy the opportunity of playing teams from outside the greater Dunedin area.

School Magazine 2023



Young Writers' Awards 2023

Entries are due Wednesday 20 September at 3:00pm.

Entries need to be e-mailed as a Word document attachment to www.wa@taieri.school.nz. The subject line must indicate the category and year level.

Entries for the Illustrated Books section (if not in electronic format) can be delivered to the English Department Office in the last week of Term 3.

SHORT STORIES

Completed individually, this can be a story consisting of a minimum of 250 words. There should be a suitable title and formatted with paragraphs. The content may be a real experience, an adapted real experience, fiction, or inspired by other stories read or viewed. It does not have to come solely from a classroom activity.



This section is completed individually. Entries need a suitable title and written in paragraphs. Present your opinions about a subject such as Road Safety, Conservation, Social Media, Politics, etc. You could be aiming to persuade the reader to act/behave/think in a different way. Or you could present information about a subject such as Taieri history, animals, ancestry, your job, an historic event, etc. Entries may relate to some study you have completed. Entries do not have to come from classroom activities.



This may be a combined effort of up to two people (e.g. a text writer and an illustrator). Options include:

(a) Children's Illustrated Book - The book must be at least six pages long, but the page size is not restricted. It should be suitable for pre-school children to read or to have read to them. (i.e. the text and pictures may be quite simple).
(b) Graphic Novel - This text needs to be at least 15 frames, using the visual and written conventions of graphic novels (comic books, anime). Entries be a full story or the beginning of a longer narrative not yet written.




Completed individually, entries can be any length, rhymed or unrhymed. Very short poems, however, may not be judged as favorably as longer ones reflecting greater effort. Use a suitable title. The subject may be serious or humorous. It may be shaped on the page.



Collaborative efforts of up to three people may submit entries in this category. Drama scripts may be any length – a simple sketch or a piece of dialogue or monologue, and could contain one or several scenes. Stage directions must be included. It should be set out as a play script with dialogue and stage directions, as well as a captivating title.

Lara Bishell (work on the left,) won an award.










Geography Maatangi Whenua Quiz
