Careers


On Tuesday 14 November 2023 we were lucky to have the team from Leonardo Helicopters from a firm in the UK visit a group of our Year 10 students to talk about a career in the engineering fields. Leonardo designs, manufactures, and sells helicopters all around the world, and has amazing graduate programmes. The students learnt about the company, what they do, and listened to the career journeys of the team. They then had some search and rescue problems to solve, and then built a device that had to float in some water and carry twenty marbles all the while thinking about cost, sustainability, and not sinking! They all displayed great teamwork, communication, and problem-solving skills, which was the object of the exercise. We hope some may see engineering as a future career choice.













Inspiring the Future Event for all Yr9's

Next week the Careers Department are running this programme to inspire our students about the breadth and depth of career opportunities that are available for all. This will be a good opportunity for parents to discuss career pathway planning and sharing a few stories from your own experience!

We will run the event on Wednesday 22 November 2023, the first session will be in the PAC, and second period students will have brief conversations with each role model in B Block.

9MI, 9CJ, 9FR, 9MG will participate P1 and P2. 9MJ, 9RG, 9RK, 9WM will follow P3 and P4.

Overview:

Inspiring the future is a fun, engaging programme, connecting school students to role models so they can learn a little bit about a wide range of careers.

How it works:

First session all the group are in the PAC

- 20 questions: Students ask questions to try to guess what the role models do you can only answer "yes", "no", "maybe", "sometimes".
- Time to guess: role models leave the room to get changed or grab their prop. Students discuss and guess each of the role model's job it's really fun hearing what they come up with!
- The reveal: role models come back wearing work clothes or carrying props that represent what
 they do. They reveal their job and briefly share their story about how they got there with the
 students.

Second sessions will be in classrooms (B Block)

 Discussion groups: We break into small groups; students sit with role models to ask questions and learn more about their job and story.

Next year we will introduce the Year 9s to our online career planning tool Career Central.
