# INFORMATION FOR PARENTS OF CURRENT YEAR 12 STUDENTS - 2024 INTENTIONS



This sheet must be filled in and returned to the Form Teacher no later than **Friday 13 October 2023**.

Students not intending to return to Taieri College must also complete the form by ticking the appropriate box and having it signed.

While subject choice at this stage of the year is not binding, the number of classes, and staff allocation, are based on this return, and therefore this should be filled in as accurately as possible. Any changes that are necessary after this intention sheet is returned can be made only with the approval of the Year 13 Dean. Students should bring a signed note requesting the change, and give it to their form teacher to pass on to the Dean.

In 2024 Year 13 students studying four or five Achievement Standard NCEA Level 3 subjects are required to do **five subjects**, the sixth being a study. Students studying less than four Achievement Standard NCEA Level 3 subjects are required to do **six subjects**. These subjects can be from any Level 1, 2 or 3. Students must take care that the subjects they choose fit in with their future plans. Where a student is undecided about their future, they must maintain a broad base of subjects. An interview should be made if a student is uncertain about what is needed for a particular future vocation.

Trades Academy students choose TAT, TAW, AUT plus **three other subjects**

Students who plan to pursue university studies should be taking five Achievement Standard NCEA Level 3 subjects. There are specific requirements for entry to University and some other Tertiary courses. Check these out before course selection.

A booklet provided to all students contains information on all subjects available. Note that, in general, subjects only operate where there are sufficient students choosing that subject.
